## PRESS CONFERENCE

that will take place

on Thursday, September 28, 2000 at 10 a.m.  
in BIBIANA, Panská 41, Bratislava.

The project has been developed as a BIBIANA's contribution to the centennial of Antoine de Saint-Exupéry. The "TRACING THE LITTLE PRINCE" exhibition is aimed at using the thought and imaginative impetus of the book, and at paraphrasing its timeless legacy that is so closely tied with maintaining harmony in nature and in human relations.

The other show – “FLYING” – is intended to popularize among children the infancy of aviation, its booms, failures and heroes, and to evoke interest in this exciting field of human efforts. Through the exhibition, children will also be able to get acquainted with A. de Saint-Exupéry’s spirit, as the writer was a pilot, too.

The overall art design of the “*TRACING THE LITTLE PRINCE*” exhibition (subtitled “*About Both Proximate And Distant Things*”), which has been inspired by motives of *The Little Prince*, has been prepared by *Ms. Katarína Slivková*, a sculptor. *Mr. Ondrej Slivka*, a painter, has created scenario and cast of the “*FLYING*” exhibition. This show will enlighten children upon history of conquering the air by man. *Ms. Gabriela Gavalčinová* has shaped dramaturgy of the project.

Both exhibitions will be opened on September 28<sup>th</sup>, 2000, at 4 p. m.
